

This year with the pandemic adding to our annual round of fires, flood and cyclones, we need to be intentional about our observance of Lent. ASH WEDNESDAY is a day of fasting and penance and every Friday is a day of abstinence. In Canon Law those over the age of 60 are exempt, but as 80 is now the new 60, I am sure we can be disciplined in our observance of this period of increased prayer, waiting on God and gifts to those in need.
