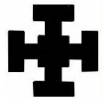

**RENEWAL OF BAPTISMAL PROMISES**

Priest: Dearly beloved brethren, now that our Lenten exercises are over, let us renew the promises made in Holy Baptism, whereby we once renounced Satan and all his works, and likewise the world which is the enemy of God, and promised to serve God faithfully in his holy Catholic Church. Therefore I ask you:
