

Word from the Wise

We now begin the long period of Sunday's after Trinity interspersed with a few High Days and Holy Days. This is the period when we are able to hear most of St Mark's gospel during the Sunday readings and catch a glimpse of how that gospel presents Jesus and his teaching, together with how the community for whom it was written dealt with the issues that faced them in their early years. This week's gospel exposes to St Mark's community what the sin against the Holy Spirit is and so we need to learn from that and apply it in our own journey as a Church and as individuals.

THE SECOND READING

2 Corinthians 4:13-5:1

A reading from the second Letter of St Paul to the Corinthians.

Brethren: Since we have the same spirit of faith as he had who wrote, “I believed, and so I spoke,” we too believe, and so we speak, knowing that he who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus and bring us with you into his presence. For it is all for your sake, so that as grace extends to more and more people it may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God.

So we do not lose heart. Though our outer man is wasting away, our inner man is being renewed every day. For this slight momentary affliction is preparing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison, because we look not to the things that are seen but to the things that are unseen; for the things that are seen are transient, but the things that are unseen are eternal.

For we know that if the earthly tent we live in is destroyed, we have a building from God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark.
