

THE FIRST READING

1 Kings 17:8-16

A reading from the first Book of Kings.

In those days: The brook [where Elijah was
hiding] dried up, because there was no rain in
their land. Then the word of the Lord came to
him. "Arise, go to Zarephath, which belongs to
Sidon, and dwell there. Behold, I have
commanded a widow there to feed you."

Elijah [the prophet] arose and went to
Zarephath, and when he came to the gate of the
city, behold, a widow was there gathering
sticks; and he called to her and said, "Bring me
a little water in a vessel, that I may drink."

And as she was going to bring it, he called to
her and said, "Bring me a morsel of bread in
your hand." And she said, "As the Lord your
God lives, I have nothing baked, only a handful
of meal in a jar, and a little oil in a pitcher; and
now, I am gathering a couple of sticks, that I
may go in and prepare it for myself and my son,
that we may eat it, and die."

yourself and your son.

Matthew 6:24-34

The reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew.

R. Glory be to thee, O Lord.

At that time: Jesus said to his disciples, "No one can serve two masters; for either he will

hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon. Therefore I tell you, do not be anxious about your life, what you shall eat or what you shall drink, nor about your body, what you shall put on.

"Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they?"

"And which of you by being anxious can add one cubit to his span of life? And why are you anxious about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they neither toil nor spin; yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like one of these. But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which today is alive and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you, O men of little faith?"

Therefore do not be anxious, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' For the Gentiles seek all these things; and your heavenly Father knows that you need them all.

But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things shall be yours as well. Therefore do not be anxious about tomorrow, for tomorrow will be anxious for itself. Let the day's own trouble be sufficient for the day."
