TABLE OF LITURGICAL DAYS ACCORDING TO THEIR ORDER OF PRECEDENCE

1. The Paschal Triduum of the Passion and Resurrection of the Lord.

 The Nativity of the Lord, the Epiphany, the Ascension, and Pentecost. Sundays of Advent, Sundays in Lent, and Sundays of Easter. Ash Wednesday.
 Weekdays of Holy Week from Monday up to and including Thursday.

Days within the Octave of Easter.

3. Solemnities inscribed in the General Calendar, whether of the Lord, of the Blessed Virgin Mary, or of Saints.

The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls).

4. Proper Solemnities, namely:

a) The Solemnity of the Title of the Ordinariate.

b) The Solemnity of the principal Patron of the place, city, or state.

c) The Solemnity of the dedication and of the anniversary of the dedication of one's own church.

d) The Solemnity of the Title of one's own church.

e) The Solemnity either of the Title or of the Founder or of the principal Patron of an Order or Congregation.

5. Feasts of the Lord inscribed in the General Calendar.

6. Sundays of Christmas Time, the Sundays after Epiphany, Septuagesima, Sexagesima, Quinquagesima, the Sundays after Trinity.

7. Feasts of the Blessed Virgin Mary and of the Saints in the General Calendar.

8. Proper Feasts, namely:

a) The Feast of the principal Patron of the Ordinariate.

b) The Feast of the anniversary of the dedication of the principal church of the Ordinariate.

c) The Feast of the principal Patron of a region or province, or a country, or of a wider territory.

d) The Feast of the Title, Founder, or principal Patron of an Order or Congregation and of a religious province, without prejudice to the prescriptions given under no. 4.

e) Other Feasts proper to an individual church.

f) Other Feasts inscribed in the Calendar of each Ordinariate.

9. Weekdays of Advent from 17th December up to and including 24th December. Days within the Octave of Christmas. Days within the Octave of Pentecost (including the Ember Days therein). Weekdays of Lent.

10. Obligatory Memorials in the General Calendar. Ember Days. Rogation Days.

11. Proper Obligatory Memorials, namely:

a) The Memorial of a secondary Patron of the place, Ordinariate, region, or religious province.

b) Other Obligatory Memorials inscribed in the Calendar of each Ordinariate, or Order or congregation.

12. Optional Memorials, which, however, may be celebrated, in the special manner described in the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal*, even on the days listed in no. 9.

In the same manner Obligatory Memorials may be celebrated as Optional Memorials if they happen to fall on Lenten weekdays.

13. Weekdays of Advent up to and including 16th December.

Weekdays of Christmas Time from 2nd January until the Saturday after the Epiphany.

Weekdays of the Easter Time from Monday after the Octave of Easter up to and including the Saturday before Pentecost.

Weekdays in Time after Epiphany and Time after Trinity.

If several celebrations fall on the same day, the one that holds the highest rank according to the Table of Liturgical Days is observed. However, a Solemnity impeded by a liturgical day that takes precedence over it should be transferred to the closest day not listed under nos. 1-8 in the Table of Precedence, provided that what is laid down in no. 5 is observed. As to the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord, whenever it falls on any day of Holy Week, it shall always be transferred to the Monday after the Second Sunday of Easter. Other celebrations are omitted in that year.

Should Evening Prayer of the current day's Office and First Evensong (Evening Prayer I) of the following day be assigned for celebration on the same day, then Evening Prayer of the celebration with the higher rank in the Table of Liturgical Days takes precedence; in cases of equal rank, Evening Prayer of the current day takes precedence.

A DECREE PERMITTING CERTAIN CUSTOMARY USAGES IN THE DAILY OFFICE WITHIN THE PERSONAL ORDINARIATE OF OUR LADY OF THE SOUTHERN CROSS

- Given that since the First Sunday of Advent, 2021, the new *Divine Worship: Daily Office* (Commonwealth Edition), 2021, is now the typical edition for use in the Daily Office celebrated within the Personal Ordinariate of Our Lady of the Southern Cross, in Australia, Japan, Guam, and in those other places where its jurisdiction pertains; I hereby issue the following provisions in regard to those customary usages which heretofore had been permitted within the said Personal Ordinariate:
- §1. The Nunc Dimittis, during the celebration of Evensong, may be said or sung with an antiphon. The instruction in Note 23. in the "General Introduction" of *Divine Worship: Daily Office (Commonwealth Edition)*, page 17, that, "No Antiphon is said for the Nunc Dimittis at Evening Prayer" is made optional, and the force of this prohibition does not apply hereafter in the Personal Ordinariate of Our Lady of the Southern Cross. The optional Antiphon used on the Nunc Dimittis may be the Salva nos, Domine, (Preserve us, O Lord,...) or one of the seasonal antiphons - see §2.
- §2. In sung celebrations of the Daily Office, the Antiphons upon the Benedictus, Magnificat, and Nunc Dimittis may be taken from: Palmer, G. H., "Antiphons upon Benedictus from the Salisbury Antiphoner." (Wantage: St Mary's Press, 1958); and, "The Antiphons upon Magnificat & Nunc Dimittis from the Salisbury Antiphoner., New & Revised Edition." (Wantage: St Mary's Press, 1930), or alternately from, Trentholme, E.C., and Palmer, G. H., "Antiphons to Magnificat and Nunc Dimittis." (London: Society of Saint John the Evangelist, 1911); and the antiphons, hymns and sequences, and other chants, from, "The Order of Compline throughout the Year with the Musical Notation from the Salisbury Antiphoner." (Wantage: St Mary's Press, 1899). If it is preferred, as allowed for by Rubric §78 of the Divine Worship: Divine Office (Commonwealth Edition), the equivalent chant in Latin from the Sarum Antiphonal may be used for the equivalent celebration (Sarum being an approved Use, never

abrogated, of the Roman Rite). The text of the chant for these antiphons in English, or Latin, may be sung as it is given, or it may be sung to adapted or simplified chants, or sung more simply with a Psalm tone. Antiphons upon the Canticles may be sung in the ancient manner, by the *incipit* only being sung before the Canticle, and the whole antiphon recitated after the conclusion of it. An Antiphon whose *incipit* has the same text as the very beginning of the Psalm or Canticle is not repeated at the beginning, but is recited in full at the conclusion.

§3. — The following Proper Psalms may be used on these respective celebrations:

(a.) — On 24th December, Christmas Eve, at First Evensong: Psalm 18:1-19

(b.) — On Holy Saturday, at Mattins: Psalm 88

(c.) — On the Eve of Pentecost, at First Evensong: Psalm 33.

§4. — The following provisions are permitted concerning the canticles used after the First Lesson at Mattins:

(a.) — The canticle, *Surge, illuminare,* may be said daily during Advent. The translation to be used of the *Surge, illuminare* is found in the Appendix to this Decree and is given in the Ordo.

(b.) — The canticle, *Kyrie Pantokrator*, may be said on weekdays from the Monday after Septuagesima Sunday until the Saturday before Passion Sunday. The translation to be used of the *Kyrie Pantokrator* is found in the Appendix to this Decree and is given in the Ordo.

(c.) — The canticle, *Salvator Mundi*, may be used on Sundays from the First Sunday of Lent until Palm Sunday, and on weekdays in Passiontide, and Holy Week. The translation to be used of the *Salvator Mundi* is found in the Appendix to this Decree and is given in the Ordo.

(d.) — The canticle, *Quarite Dominum*, may be used on Fridays in Epiphanytide, and Trinitytide. The translation to be used of the *Quarite Dominum* is found in the Appendix to this Decree and is given in the Ordo.

(e.) — The canticle, *Benedictus es, Domine,* may be used on all Ferias, Obligatory Memorials and Optional Memorials. The translation to be used of the *Benedictus es, Domine* is found in the Appendix to this Decree and is given in the Ordo.

(f.) — The canticle, *Benedicite, Omnia Opera,* may be used on Sundays in Advent, and Pre-Lent. It may also be used on ferial days. The version permitted to be

used, both on Sundays and weekdays, is the shorter form found on pages 384-385 of Divine Worship: Daily Office (Commonwealth Edition).

(g.) — The canticle, *Te Deum*, may be said daily, notwithstanding the laudable tradition of refraining from its use during the weekdays of Advent, Pre-Lent, and Lent, Passiontide and Holy Week, and on Ember Days and other Penitential Days.

- §5. When the Office of the Dead is said, except on All Souls' Day and Anzac Day, the Lessons of the current day may be used.
- §6. The Antiphon on the Invitatory Psalm, Venite, or, Jubilate Deo, or other Seasonal Invitatory, may be said more simply by its recitation once before the canticle and once after the Gloria Patri, or other doxology at the conclusion of the canticle.
- §7. The following provisions are permitted concerning the Office Hymns used at Mattins and Evensong:

(a.) — Such hymns as were given in the Commons, Votives and Ferias, published in the Personal Ordinariate of Our Lady of the Southern Cross in 2021, are permitted to continue to be used. Such hymns as a given in the Ordo of any year are likewise permitted to be used in celebrations of the Daily Office.

(b.) — The hymn, *Alleluia, dulce carmen,* is permitted to be used as the Office Hymn on the Eve of Septuagesima. When the laudable custom of the ceremonial burial of the Alleluia, the *Depositio Alleluia,* is carried out, the Office Hymn remains *Deus Creator omnium.* The *Depositio Alleluia* takes place after the Third Collect at Evensong: The hymn *Alleluia, dulce carmen* is sung, during which the board inscibed with the Paschal Alleluia is sprinkled with holy water and then incensed, the solemn procession is then formed and the Alleluia is taken to the place of "burial", accompanied by the Antiphon, *In Paradisum,* with Psalm 114, *In exitu Israel,* found in the Burial Service on page 126 of *Divine Worship: Occasional Services.* After the ceremonial burial, Psalm 103:13-17, on page 130 of *Divine Worship: Occasional Services,* is sung as the procession makes its way back to the sanctuary for the conclusion of Evensong. Additional Alleluias may be sung as tropes in the Magnificat on this day.

(c.) — Such seasonal and festal hymns as were given in the OLSC Ordos of 2020 and 2021, and those in "The Hymner, containing Translations of the Hymns from the Sarum Breviary together with Sundry Sequences & Processions," Second Edition, (London: Plainsong & Medieval Music Society, 1905), and in the "Collected Hymns, Sequences and Carols of John Mason Neale." (London: Hodder and

Stoughton, 1914), even where these differ from the texts of those given in *Divine Worship: Divine Office (Commonwealth Edition)*, are permitted to be used on the appropriate celebrations.

- §8. On the Nineteenth Day of the Month, when the Venite is used at the Invitatory of Mattins, the Psalmody may continue at Psalm 96. It is not required to say the Jubilate Deo in exchange for Psalm 95 on this day.
- §9. Psalm 100, the *Jubilate Deo*, may be used as the Invitatory Psalm on all Solemnities, Feasts, and on the Third to Seventh Sundays during Eastertide.
- §10. The Angelus through the Year, or the Regina Cali in Eastertide, according to laudable custom, may be recited before Mattins and Evensong daily, except during the Sacred Triduum.
- §11. The Psalms at the Divine Office may be accompanied by antiphons. At Mattins or Evensong, these may be taken from those in "The English Office Book," Revised Edition (London: Church Literature Association, 1956), or in the case of Compline from "The Order of Compline throughout the Year with the Musical Notation from the Salisbury Antiphoner," (Wantage: St Mary's Press, 1899). At the Lesser Hours of Prime, Terce, Sext, and None, the antiphons may be taken from, "The Lesser Hours of the Sarum Breviary" (London: Swan Sonnenschein, 1889), or in the Antiphons upon the Psalms may be sung in the ancient manner described in §2..
- §12. The following, with the usual amendment, in the case of a lay Officiant, may be said at the Offices of Mattins and Evensong immediately after the Third Collect:

♥. The Lord be with you. or, ♥. O Lord, hear our prayer.

R? Thanks be to God.

₿⁄ Amen.

During the Easter & the Pentecost Octaves, and on the Eve of Septuagesima, the double Alleluia is added thus:

The Lord be with you. *or*, X O Lord, hear our prayer.
And with thy spirit. *or*, X And let our cry come unto thee.
Let us bless the Lord. Alleluia. Alleluia.
Thanks be to God. Alleluia. Alleluia.

 May the souls of the Faithful Departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. **R** Amen.

§13. — Immediately before Compline begins, the following Versicle may be said:

ℜ Turn us, O God our Saviour.ℜ And let thine anger cease from us.

The Service then continues immediately with:

ℜ The Lord Almighty grant us a quiet night and a perfect end.
 ℜ Amen.

- §14. If the Psalms are accompanied with an antiphon at Compline, the Antiphon is said before and after the entire Psalmody. Either the entire antiphon is sung before and after, or this may take the form described in §2.: the *incipit* only being said before the Psalmody, and the whole antiphon recited after the final Gloria Patri of Psalm 134.
- §15. From Christmas Eve until the Baptism of the Lord, and on Solemnities, and Feasts through the Year, except in Lent or Eastertide up to the Friday before the Eve of Pentecost, the Hymn, *Salvator mundi, Domine, (See the Appendix)* may be sung at Compline in place of the *Te Lucis ante terminum*, with appropriate variations in the doxological verse.
- §16. At the lesser hours of Prime, Terce, Sext, None, and Compline, the Chapters and Responsories given may be replaced with those found for the same or equivalent celebrations in, "The Lesser Hours of the Sarum Breviary" (London: Swan Sonnenschein, 1889).

The Texts of those additonal canticles permitted to be used according to the decree are attached below:

(a.)

At Mattins in Advent: *First Canticle* — *Surge, illuminare.* THE THIRD SONG OF ISAIAH. *Isaiah 60:1–3, 11a, 14c, 18–19*

RISE, shine, for thy light is come, * and the glory of the LORD is risen upon thee.

For behold, the darkness shall cover the earth; * and gross darkness the people:

But the LORD shall arise upon thee, * and his glory shall be seen upon thee.

And the Gentiles shall come to thy light, * and kings to the brightness of thy rising.

Therefore thy gates shall be open continually; * they shall not be shut day nor night.

They shall call thee, The City of the Lord, * The Zion of the HOLY ONE of Israel.

Violence shall no more be heard in thy land, * wasting nor destruction within thy borders.

But thou shalt call thy walls, Salvation, * and thy gates Praise.

The sun shall no more be thy light by day; * neither for brightness shall the moon give light unto thee:

The hymn, Alleluia, dulce carmen, is permitted to be used as the Office Hymn on the Eve of Septuagesima. When the laudable custom of the ceremonial burial of the Alleluia, the Depositio Alleluia, is carried out, the Office Hymn remains instead, Deus Creator omnium. The Depositio Alleluia takes place after the Third Collect at Evensong: The hymn Alleluia, dulce carmen is sung, during which the board inscibed with the Paschal Alleluia is sprinkled with holy water and then incensed. The solemn procession is then formed and the Alleluia is taken to the place of burial, accompanied by the Antiphon, In Paradisum, with Psalm 114, In exitu Israel, found in the Burial Service on page 126 of Divine Worship: Occasional Services. After the ceremonial burial, Psalm 103:13-17, on page 130 of Divine Worship: Occasional Services, is sung as the procession makes its way back to the sanctuary for the conclusion of Evensong. Additional Alleluias may be sung as tropes in the Magnificat on this day. The double Alleluia is permitted at the dismissal (See below).

THE BEATING OF THE BOUNDS

The tradition of processing along the parish boundaries and beating the bounds with willow rods or other wooden canes, marking the corners with the numerals of the year in chalk (MMXXII) is an ancient English custom observed during Rogationide or on Ascension Day. Given that our communities, being personal in nature, rather than geographical as such, do not have definite parish boundaries as yet, it may be more conducive to celebrate this ritual by holding a procession around the church in which we regularly worship, and perhaps the block on which it stands.

A SUGGESTED RITUAL FOR THE BEATING OF THE BOUNDS

Officiant: In the Name of the Father, ★ and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost.

All: Amen.

- *Officiant:* Our help ★ is in the Name of the Lord.
- All: Who hath made heaven and earth.
- (In Rogationtide:) Officiant: O give thanks to the Lord, for he is gracious, alleluia.
- All: And his mercy endureth for ever, alleluia.

(If on Asension:) Officiant: Christ is gone up with a merry noise, alleluia.

All: And the Lord with the sound of the trump, alleluia.

Officiant: Let us proceed in peace. *All:* In the ₩ name of Christ. Amen.

The Litany is said, or sung [DOCE:343-349], while the procession moves, but it is interrupted each time the procession arrives at a corner or a significant landmark. At these, the Officiant, calls out, "Mark, mark, mark," the people then beat the bounds with their canes, and the Officiant inscribes the numerals of the year in the left-over, blessed chalk from the Epiphanytide house blessing. The number should be inscribed as: AD MMXXIII. The procession continues with the resumption of the Litany after each marking, and concludes with the singing of the SOLEMN TE $D \in UM$ 0 F THANKSGIVING [DWM:1071-1072], using the Collect of the Vigil of the Ascension, or of the Ascension, of Rogationtide, or of the Day of the Dedication of a Church, and followed by the REGINA CÆLI.
